#### **Australian Plants and Animals**

Some of the most amazing animals and plants God made are found only in Australia.

The **kangaroo** is the largest of the **marsupials** (animals which carry their babies in a pouch). Kangaroos hop using their large back legs and their tail. Kangaroos can hop at speeds up to 60



km/h—that's as fast as cars drive around the city! Kangaroos like to eat grass, young plants and leaves. A baby kangaroo is called a joey.



The koala is another marsupial with thick, soft fur like a teddy-bear. And just like teddy-bears, koalas love to sleep! They also like to eat leaves from the eucalyptus trees where they live. A baby koala is also called a joey. When it is old enough the joey moves from the mother's pouch and rides on her back.

This spiky animal is called the echidna. Echidnas use their sharp spikes to protect themselves from other animals. They like to catch and eat hundreds of ants and termites using their long, sticky tongue. They poke their tongue down into the ant



holes. This is why the echidna is sometimes called a spiny ant-eater.




everyone too! Very soon the gospel had spread to Europe.
